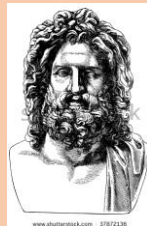
Jean de La Fontaine was a French poet and fabulist, who lived and worked during the XVII century. Published in 1668, the collection of fables brought La Fontaine international fame.
